EXCELLENCE AT RRCC

Theater Department Wins Bernice Joseph Award

Red Rocks Community College was named the winner of the 2021 Bernice Joseph award by the Western Alliance of Community College Academic Leaders (the Alliance) for its inventive and creative plan for how a Spring 2020 theatre history class would respond to a theater closure during a pandemic as artistic directors/producers. The Alliance created the Award to recognize problem-solving and innovation among community colleges in the western United States while honoring Bernice Joseph, an influential University of Alaska educator who passed away in 2014.

RRCC Named Best Medical Assistant School in Colorado

The RRCC Medical Assistant program was named the number one medical assistant school in Colorado for 2021, by the journal of Medical Assistant Advice. The program is committed to providing professional training that translates into suitable placements soon after graduation. Students can choose between a certificate or associate degree, depending on career goals. The RRCC family is very proud of the hard work of all the faculty and students that are part of the Medical Assistant Program!

RockSat-X Flight

RRCC students, joined students from seven other community college and universities, to help with the launch of the Terrier-Improved Malemute sounding rocket from NASA's Wallops Flight Facility.

RRCC students collaboratively worked on projects with a mix of technology and science experiments. The projects included development of a 360-degree camera for sounding rockets, space debris removal concepts, solar array deployment system, and collecting of space particles for research on the origins of life. The experiments are being flown through the RockSat-X program in partnership with the Colorado Space Grant Consortium. This was the tenth flight of a RockSat-X payload, and the experiments, along with any stored data, will be provided to students.

ENDING STUDENT FOOD INSECURITY

COVID -19 changed everyone's daily lives. It also created a serious food assistance access issue for students. As both RRCC campuses went remote, the college saw that students' needs for food assistance were greater than ever. Student Life had run a non-need based food bank for several years prior to COVID. During the campus closures, Student Life pivoted to provide home deliveries, as well as curbside pick-ups. This was a lifeline for many of our students, and it also highlighted how vital the food pantry was to so many RRCC students. An effort was made to create a more substantial food program for RRCC students.

The importance of food security was recognized by many people, especially one anonymous family. The family approached the Foundation to see how they could help make sure RRCC students had access to food. They agreed to donate \$5,000, if the college

could match the total. This helped to create the RRCC 5K Food Pantry Challenge. In a week's time, the RRCC community raised the matching \$5,000. The family was so impressed with the generosity shown for this cause, that they put up another \$5,000 for matching. Once again, the RRCC family stepped up, and an additional \$5,000 was raised for the food pantry. In total, just over \$20,000

was raised to support efforts of the Student Pantry.

The Student Pantry also formed a partnership with the Food Bank of the Rockies to further stretch each dollar given. The Food Bank of the Rockies provides food and necessities to people in need through signature programs and by teaming up with hundreds of Hunger Relief Partners to serve

communities across Colorado and Wyoming, the largest food bank coverage area in the contiguous United States. The Food Bank of the Rockies visits RRCC once a month with a huge semi-truck full of boxed and canned goods, some produce, and occasionally dairy and eggs.

Thanks to our community of donors, the Student Pantry has moved from a table in the hallway to an entire room on campus. The new space has an area for students to heat up items and eat together. These food resources have been so important for students this

last year. Non-perishable food or unopened hygiene items may be dropped at either the Lakewood or Arvada campuses.

CHAMPION OF EDUCATION

This past year, Dr. Trefny completed his term as the President of the RRCC Foundation Board of Directors. Dr. Trefny has also served as the President to the Colorado Community College System Board of Directors, as well as being the former President of Colorado School of Mines. During his time at the School of Mines, Dr. Trefny helped usher in the current standing transfer agreement between Red Rocks Community College and the Colorado School of Mines. During the 17-18 academic year, RRCC launched the Trefny Honors Program. Dr. Trefny's tremendous support has been felt by students here at RRCC, and throughout Colorado. Dr. Trefny is a true Champion of Education for the state of Colorado.



KEEPING STUDENTS IN CLASS

Student retention became a priority at Red Rocks in 2020-2021. Students were facing incredible financial barriers to staying in class. Last fall, college enrollment numbers dipped across the nation as students and families



made difficult decisions in the face of a global pandemic. In September of 2020, The Washington Post reported that, "Low-income students are dropping out of college this fall in alarming numbers", in a trend that was, "unusual and particular to this pandemic, as typically enrollment jumps during economic downturns when jobs are scarce."

Recent surveys on the impacts of the coronavirus pandemic show that students of color and working class, low-income, and indigenous students were experiencing higher rates of hardship. The College understood that access to a wider variety of financial aid would support our students' likelihood of completing a degree. That's when we turned to our donors to provide a much-needed lifeline for students in crisis.

During the 2020-2021 academic year, the Foundation launched an Emergency Grant program funded by private individuals and community foundations. The fund was made

available on a one-time basis to assist students in addressing the financial crisis that may cause them to drop out of school. Funds supported housing and utility needs, additional technology, childcare and a host of other needs. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, over \$165,000 in support went out to 348 students in need. The average award per student was \$476. That gift meant the difference between staying in class or dropping out for these students.

When low income students stop attending school, they rarely return, diminishing their job and wage prospects for the rest of their lives. After taking just one year off from college, students overall are 30% less likely to ever earn a bachelor's degree. Moreover, students who stop before finishing their degree find themselves entering the workforce in a weak economy and during a time of great chaos and uncertainty.


