including credit for prior learning, competency-based models, and innovative models to increase access to credentials for underprepared learners.

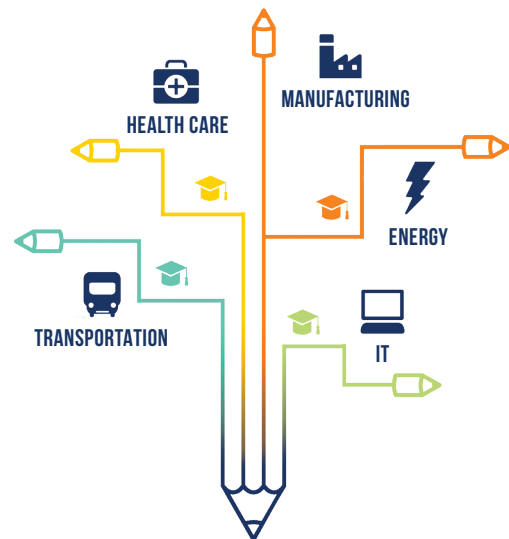
